Who made this report ?

Llais listens to people about Health and Care services.

What happened ?

On **5th March 2025**, Llais Powys had a meeting in Presteigne.

People talked about their problems with **health** and **social care services**.











What people told us ?

Going to the GP

It's hard to get an appointment.

People wait **3 to 4 weeks** to see a doctor.

Services like **blood tests** are not always available.

Poor Communication

Doctors and hospitals don't always talk to each other.

People don't know who to speak to or when.



3 to 4 weeks !





Women's Health

No local place to get **coil fittings**.

People have to travel to Builth Wells.

Mental Health

People are worried about young people's **mental health.**

Some young people have died by suicide.

There is not enough help after support ends.







Social Care and End of Life Support

Not enough help for carers or families.

Staff are busy and don't have enough time.

Carers have to use the phone a lot - that can be hard.

Funding Problems

Knighton Hospital closed. This makes care harder to get.

Places like the **Day Centre** and **Home Support Team** might lose money.









Cross Border Problems

Services in **England** and **Wales** don't always work together.

This causes problems in border towns like **Presteigne**.




What does this mean ?
